

What is meant by art education, the goals of art education

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What is meant by artistic education: Art education is education through art. Objectives of Art Education Art education generally aims to develop the human personality in an integrated development that includes mental, psychological, moral and physical aspects ... etc. In line with this, art education has a key role in achieving that integrated growth, as it contributes to the development of the mental, psychological, emotional and moral aspects, as well as its clear role in developing some physical aspects by providing students with some muscular and manual skills and developing some senses, especially human ones. The objectives of art education, in particular, are as follows: -Developing the creative ability: The highest thing in man as a living being is his creative ability.
